First-ever D.C. Middle School Truancy Diversion Program Graduation to be held this Tuesday

This fall, Judge Lee Satterfield, former head of Family Court, presided over the first-ever truancy program for middle school students in Washington, D.C. This Tuesday, the first 10 students to complete the program will participate in a graduation ceremony at Garnet-Patterson Middle School. Next semester the program will expand to another D.C. middle school.

The program is an effort to help students and their parents confront the underlying issues that cause repeated unexcused absences. It included weekly sessions for parents and teens with the judge, as well as meetings with social workers from a neighborhood collaborative to help the families address the causes of the unexcused school absences.
