D.C. Superior Court Adds Three Magistrate Judges to Fill Recent Retirements

The DC Superior Court's Board of Judges today approved three new magistrate judges, appointed to fill the vacancies created by the retirements of Magistrate Judges Diana Harris Epps, Karen Howze and Michael McCarthy:
