

**SUPERIOR COURT OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 17-15**

Additions to the Probate Fiduciary Panel of Attorneys

WHEREAS, Chief Judge Lee F. Satterfield issued Administrative Order 15-18 on September 14, 2015, re-establishing the Probate Fiduciary Panel for a four year period of time, as required by Administrative Order 15-01, and also providing for the periodic replenishment of the Panel; and

WHEREAS, on April 20, 2017, Chief Judge Robert E. Morin issued Administrative Order 17-08, providing for the supplementation of the Panel prior to its next reconstitution in 2019, and Administrative Order 17-09, re-establishing the Probate Panel Implementation Committee (the “Committee”); and

WHEREAS, the Committee has reviewed and considered all applications submitted between April 20, 2017 and June 1, 2017, submitted its report on its procedures for evaluating applications, and recommended names of attorneys to be appointed to the Probate Fiduciary Panel as Full and Provisional Members; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Judge is satisfied that the recommendations of the Probate Panel Implementation Committee with respect to the attorneys to be placed on the Probate Fiduciary Panel have been made after careful study and consideration of each attorney eligible to be considered and should be accepted in their entirety without change; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the administration of justice for these recommendations to be implemented at this time;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is by the Court,

ORDERED, that the attached list shall encompass additions to the Probate Fiduciary Panel, as re-established by Administrative Order 15-18, and attorneys listed are appointed as Full or Provisional Members as set forth in the attached list; and it is further

ORDERED, that, absent suspension or removal, the attorneys hereby appointed to the Full Panel are appointed until the date of re-establishment of the Panel in 2019, at which time they must submit an application for reappointment, pending the determination of which they may remain Probate Fiduciary Panel members; and it is further

ORDERED, that newly-appointed Provisional Members are appointed for a term of one year, at which time they will be evaluated by the Committee for Full Membership, and if approved for Full Membership, must re-apply for appointment when the Panel is re-established in 2019; and it is further

ORDERED, that an attorney's membership on the Probate Fiduciary Panel is conditioned upon his or her compliance with all Administrative Orders setting an annual cap for attorney compensation for appointed representation; and it is further

ORDERED, that newly-appointed attorneys will be eligible to receive Court appointments upon notification by the Presiding Judge of the Probate & Tax Division that the attorneys have received the necessary training; and it is further


ORDERED, that any eligible attorney who submitted an application between April 20, 2017 and June 1, 2017, and who was not appointed to the Probate Fiduciary Panel may re-apply when the Panel is re-established in 2019; and it is further

ORDERED, that this Order shall take effect on the 28th day of September, 2017.
