

ORDER

On consideration of appellee's petition for rehearing or rehearing en banc, and appellant's response thereto, it is

Appellant may file a reply brief within 21 days after appellee's brief is filed. Each party shall file ten copies of its briefs. These new briefs shall be specifically designed for consideration by and addressed to the *en banc* court and shall supersede all briefs previously filed in this appeal.
